Subject: **Agenda Item XIX: Consideration of resolution authorizing a letter in support of Senate Bill 153, California Clean Water, Clean Air, Safe Neighborhood Parks, and Coastal Protection Act of 2006.**

Staff Recommendation: That the Governing Board adopt the attached resolution, authorizing a letter in support of Senate Bill 153.

Background: According to the most recent version of this proposed bill, if adopted, this bill would authorize for the purpose of financing a program for the acquisition, development, improvement, preservation, rehabilitation, and restoration of agricultural, coastal, cultural, forest, historical, park, recreational, and water resources in the state, as specified, the issuance, pursuant to the State General Obligation Bond Law, of bonds in the amount of \$3,595,000,000.
