SUBJECT: **Agenda Item IX: Consideration of resolution authorizing acceptance of conservation easements over APNs 4453-016-902 and 4453-020-901 from the Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority, Carbon Canyon, unincorporated Los Angeles County.**

Staff Recommendation: That the Governing Board adopt the attached resolution authorizing acceptance of conservation easements over all or portions of APNs 4453-016-902 and 4453-020-901 from the Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority, Carbon Canyon.

Background: These properties contain a 1,300-foot stretch of the Carbon Canyon Creek in the Santa Monica Mountains. The property has already benefitted from a riparian habitat mitigation project, which has cleared debris and exotic plant species from the stream banks and adjacent areas. A series of native plants has been installed and mitigation activities will continue through 2018.

In April 2008, the Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) and Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) issued a new set of rules for all mitigation programs, such as the Los Angeles County Aquatic Resources In-Lieu Fee Mitigation Program (Program), administered by the MRCA. This rule requires that mitigation sites be held under a third party conservation easement to ensure permanent site protection.

This action would authorize the DMCA to accept conservation easements over portions of the subject properties. The properties are within the jurisdictional boundary of the DMCA. There are no statutory requirements that require the DMCA to conduct any monitoring or reporting on the easement. Exact easement delineation details will be determined at a later date, and will be drawn in the most efficient manner to simplify the legal description. See attached map.
